



## Bronze Medallion – Full Course

**Delivery Mode:** Face to Face – no pre-learning required – all the material will be given to the participant on the course

**Location:** The course is conducted in Geraldton and other locations in Western Australia.

**Pre-requisites:** Nil although a reasonable level of swimming ability is required

**Age requirements:** 14 years old or turning 14 years old in the same calendar year the participant wants to attend the course

### **Certification obtained after completing the course:**

Bronze Medallion Award and Resuscitation Award.

### **Getting the Certificate:**

The Bronze Medallion and Resuscitation Award will be issued within 10 working days after attending the course. 20 working days during summer time.

### **Duration of the Certificate:**

The Bronze Medallion and the Resuscitation Award are valid for 12 months. If the Qualifications expire the candidate can still attend the Bronze Medallion Requalification course. (We suggest attending a full course if the Qualification has expired for more than 12 months)
